Course Title: DRIVE

Course Duration: 30 minutes – 3 hours depending on experience

Program: Driver/Operator

Course Prerequisites:

Student must be a member of a fire department or fire brigade and possess a valid Driver's License.

Course Description: This course is designed for students who are or may be responsible for driving emergency vehicles. Students will receive a brief instructional presentation, then participate in driving simulator exercises that will enhance the lessons learned. Students will develop their skills through repeated practice of techniques. Emergency response scenarios will reinforce the use of these techniques and real-time decision making to avoid crashes.

One module is covered per *DRIVE* session. Students will be placed into the appropriate module during their first session in the DRIVE simulator. Students are encouraged to follow the progression of the modules and track their progress using the DRIVE Progress Card.

At the conclusion of this module, the student will demonstrate safely operating an emergency vehicle when responding to an emergency.

Title: Multiple Vehicle Response Terminal Learning Objective:

At the conclusion of this module, the student will demonstrate safely operating an emergency vehicle when responding to an emergency with other emergency vehicles.

Module: 5 Title: Adverse Driving Conditions Terminal Learning Objective:

At the conclusion of this module, the student will demonstrate operating an emergency vehicle in adverse driving conditions.
