# University of Illinois Fire Service Institute Course Syllabus

Course Title: Fire Behavior and Reading Smoke

Course Duration: 4 hours

**Program:** Firefighting/Cornerstone

Course Prerequisites: None

**Course Description:** This class expands on the basic fire behavior materials learned during initial firefighting training. It focuses on the importance of deducing critical fire characteristics from the attributes of visible smoke. Students will learn how understanding smoke volume, velocity, density, and color can help predict hostile fire events, as well as tactics and strategies that are useful to prevent these events from occurring.

### **Course Requirements:**

Pre-Course Work – None Course Work – Attend and participate in all lectures and demonstrations. Post-Course Work – None
