Course Syllabus

Course Title: Propane Fire Fighting

Course Duration: 4 hours

Program: Propane, Oil, and Gas

Course Prerequisites: None

Course Description: Liquified Petroleum Gas (LPG) Emergencies is a course aimed at personnel (emergency responders, Industry and Hazardous Materials teams) who may respond to handle Liquefied Petroleum Gas emergencies. The students will learn what LPG is and tactics for handling emergency situations involving LPG. The course includes hands-on training for handling and controlling live flammable gas releases.

Course Requirements:

Pre-Course Work – None Course Work – Attend and participate in lectures and drills. Post-Course Work – None

Course Policies:

Safety Policy: Students shall understand and follow all instructions pertaining to operational safety, as stated by instructors or as written in course materials.
