NVFC INSTRUCTED COURSES:

CREATING A PSYCHOLOGICALLY HEALTHY FIRE DEPARTMENT 4 HOURS: FRIDAY, 1PM-5PM

This course from the National Volunteer Fire Council and the American Psychological Association's Center for Organizational Excellence is designed to empower fire department leadership to promote and support healthy, high-performing fire/EMS departments. Based on the framework from the Psychologically Healthy Fire Departments initiative, this course focuses on six key practices - member involvement, health and safety, member growth and development, work-life balance, member recognition, and effective communication - to facilitate member well-being and department functioning.

VOLUNTEER RECRUITMENT & RETENTION FOR THE EMERGENCY SERVICES 4 HOURS: SATURDAY, 8AM-12PM

Many fire and EMS departments across the nation are struggling to find new volunteer members and retain their current members. This session discusses the challenges of recruiting volunteers, presents valuable research collected as part of the NVFC's Make Me A Firefighter campaign, and offers ideas to help overcome recruiting challenges. During the second half of the session, retention challenges, potential solutions, and the importance of leadership will be covered.

VOLUNTEER FIRE SERVICE CULTURE: ESSENTIAL STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS 4 HOURS: SATURDAY, 1PM-5PM

The NVFC published the textbook Volunteer Fire Service Culture – Essential Strategies for Success as a guide to fire service leaders who desire to change their department's culture and attitude towards personal health and safety. This training delves into key points from the guide to reinforce the need for change and provide a roadmap for implementation of change to improve the health and safety of volunteer fire and EMS responders.

HANDS-ON COURSES:

FOUNDATIONS & ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTING 12 HOURS: FRIDAY, 1-5PM & SATURDAY, 8AM-5PM



The Foundations and Essential Skills for Firefighting Course incorporates multiple training topics into one convenient schedule. The course will cover the usage of self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), line advancement, ventilation and basic fire ground operations. Instructors will also address forcible entry and thermal imaging camera applications. Students will participate in hands-on drills and live fire scenarios that support skill development and competency. This class is appropriate for students with limited to moderate fire service experience. *NFPA compliant personal protective equipment and SCBA are required.*

ENGINE AND TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS 12 HOURS: FRIDAY, 1-5PM & SATURDAY, 8AM-5PM

The Engine and Truck Company Operations course is designed for all skill levels. Topics include hose line advancement, searching from a line, ventilation, and getting water to the fire. Students will also focus on exterior and interior truck company operations, including ladders, ventilation, search, and forcible entry techniques. Students will work in large and small companies to test their skills in multiple operations and scenarios with a variety of smoke and heat conditions.

NFPA compliant personal protective equipment and SCBA are required.

SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING

8 HOURS: SATURDAY, 8AM-5PM

The Single-Family Dwelling Course is a hands-on class designed for all skill levels. Topics will include size-up, searching for the fire, advancing the primary and back-up lines, and fire suppression. The class combines a brief classroom discussion with multiple, realistic scenarios that will challenge all skill levels.

NFPA compliant personal protective equipment and SCBA are required.

VERTICAL ROPE AWARENESS

8 HOURS: SATURDAY, 8AM-5PM

The Vertical Rope Awareness Course is a hands-on class that provides personnel with the basic knowledge at the awareness level for skills needed to perform rescues using rope systems. The class will cover the use of rope, rope equipment, knots, hardware, construction of mechanical advantage systems, belay and safety systems, anchor systems, patient packaging low angle self-rescue along with low angle litter operations.

Helmet, heavy duty long pants and long sleeve shirt, gloves and work boots are required.

COLLAPSE AWARENESS

4 HOURS: FRIDAY, 1-5PM

The Collapse Awareness Course is appropriate for all skill levels. The class is designed to deliver awareness and beginning operations level training to students with limited collapse rescue experience. Course topics will apply basic structural collapse response and rescue considerations to a realistic training environment. Experienced instructors will discuss initial size-up, building construction considerations, tool selection and usage, scene safety, basic lifting, and rescue techniques. This class will be hands-on and engaging and allow students the opportunity to practice response and rescue techniques in a controlled collapse environment.

Helmet, gloves, eye protection, ear protection, work boots and work clothes are required.

CLASSROOM COURSE:

ALTERNATIVE FUEL VEHICLES 4 HOURS: FRIDAY, 1-5PM

This Alternative Fuel Vehicles Course introduces students to new technologies not encountered in the past that can impact rescue efforts. Topics covered include hybrid or electric driven vehicles, alternative fuel systems, dangerous drive train components, hazardous mechanical and hydraulic systems, plus more. Rescue challenges associated with air bags and their deployment and detonation systems, pre-tension systems and other passive restraint devices throughout the passenger compartment are also discussed. Methods of construction, vehicle body components and their materials of construction offer challenges not found at accident scenes in the past.

CERTIFICATION COURSE:

TACTICAL EMERGENCY CASUALTY CARE/ RESCUE TASK FORCE TRAINING

16 HOURS | FRIDAY, 1PM-5PM & SATURDAY, 8AM-5PM & SUNDAY, 8AM-12PM

The Tactical Emergency Casualty Care/Rescue Task Force Training (TECC/RTF) Course is an EMS-based class designed for all skill levels. The class covers topics that decrease preventable deaths from active shooter, hostile, or mass casualty events. The TECC program includes discussions, table top, and full immersion exercises. Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive TECC certification from the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT).

Lodging Details:

- The IFA will pay for hotel room and hotel room taxes only.

HANDS-ON COURSE PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES:

SCBA: SCBA must be NFPA compliant and in working order. Only SCBA with current hydrostatic dated cylinders will be allowed. Students must provide their own equipment. No sharing is allowed. Loaner equipment and repair services will not be available.

FACIAL HAIR: Facial hair that crosses the jaw line is not permitted in courses where breathing apparatus will be used. No exceptions.

AGE: Students must be 18 years of age or older and a member of a fire department in order to participate in the hands-on training.

CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL OR ILLEGAL DRUGS: Any indication of the consumption of alcohol or illegal drugs by participants during any hands-on training will result in denial from the program. Instructors will have full discretion to enforce this policy.
